Leaning on God

he other day I went up to morning prayers and I found the table beautifully covered with daffodils and large pebbles/stones. Blue and brown fabric fell down, alongside the potted tree from the morning room, and across the floor in front of the table in folds playing with the small gems, candles and more pebbles. We were

to look at Psalm 15 which asks the question: 'Who may stay in God's temple or live on the holy mountain of the Lord?' The answer describes a person who appears flawless, perfect even! Psalm 15 presented me with a conundrum: although I try to obey God, this person is definitely not me!

So I chose to sit at the back, hiding behind a pillar facing the Taizé cross. As I sat and faced the cross, there in front of me was God's greatest gift - Himself. There was the gift of GRACE. The gift of the RESURRECTION. The gift of Eph 2 v 8: 'Because of his kindness, you have been saved through trusting Christ. And even trusting is not of yourselves; it too is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good we have done, so none of us can take any credit for it.' However much I try, I cannot live up to the standards of Psalm 15, but Jesus has, and because He has, I can, through Him. I leant against the pillar, the wood was warm and surprisingly comforting. I felt at peace.

After prayers, I googled paintings of sitting by trees and found 'Mary sitting in a wood'. I was drawn to the dappled light, the hint of spring (so like Scargill), the open coat and Mary lost in her sewing, at peace and untroubled. Is there a soft cushion by her back? I do hope so, it would be rather nice if there was. Here is a beautiful painting giving substance to my thoughts, a reminder of that rare morning; of feeling cocooned, loved, accepted and forgiven. Watchman Nee wrote: 'For rightness is not our goal. The test of our actions is not, "Are they right or wrong?" But always and only, "Is the divine blessing upon them?"'

The divine blessing, is surely upon Mary sitting in a wood and I feel certain it is upon us all, if we, with the help of the Holy Spirit, and encouragement from each other, follow the example of Jesus, and seek to live the pathway of love and the kingdom.

I was invited to become Chair of the embryonic new Council in January 2009, and two of these three, Hilary Young and Stephen Weatherley, have also been there from the beginning. Those who know the Scargill resurrection story will know that the purchase of the buildings and estate was only possible because of a three-way partnership involving the Lee Abbey Movement, the 'Save Scargill' group, and the then

Stephen has been one of the two representatives of the Lee Abbey Movement on the Council, having served as a Chair of the Lee Abbey London Board, as well as being a member of the Movement Council. He was an ideal choice for two reasons in particular: one that he lived near Leeds and so was local, and secondly because of his background in business and project management. We have been richly blessed not only by the vital professional experience Stephen has brought over the years, but also by the wisdom and spiritual insights he has brought to many aspects of the Council's work.

Hilary was part of the 'Save Scargill' group, representing people who had enjoyed a long term involvement with Scargill, and were understandably distressed by the way in which the 'doors had been

closed' in the summer of 2008. At the time Hilary was a Vicar in the Diocese of Liverpool, but in due course moved much nearer to Scargill, becoming Vicar of Settle. That in itself was a reflection of the commitment she has shown to Scargill. Furthermore, it was important that we had someone on the new Council who represented continuity with the past, but also recognised the need for new beginnings. Despite a further move south to serve in the Diocese of Ely, Hilary has remained passionately committed to Scargill's life and ministry, for which we are deeply grateful.

Especially for the Lee Abbey Movement, who were providing a substantial loan to enable the purchase of Scargill, it was crucial they knew we had Trustees with professional financial expertise. We've actually ended up with three accountants on the Council, (!), but here I pay tribute to John Fell, who since 2010 has chaired the Finance and Business committee of the Council. In the years since 2010, we've faced many significant financial challenges. Equally,

we have seen, time and again, remarkable provision through God's people. Working closely with Tony Hesselwood and Dave Lucas, John has given us such confidence especially through his detailed monthly reports, which are a mix of 'faith-filled' and 'realistically earthed', and always brought with his wonderful dry sense of humour!

As I myself step down from chairing the Council - which I do with mixed feelings - I want to offer my heartfelt thanks to these three, and indeed to all my fellow Trustees, for their commitment to the Scargill adventure, which is itself a reflection of their love for Jesus and his kingdom work. What a ride it's been....and no doubt will continue to be! To God be the glory!

To add to Bishop Chris' tributes, those members of the Council who are stepping down have shared with me a treasure trove of stories and highlights...

Before the resurrection of Scargill, Hilary was a 'vision person,' coming to pray on the closed estate, encouraged by spring flowers blooming without human input and feeling 'a strong sense that the place was not dead, but sleeping, awaiting awakening to new life.' Stephen admits to initial doubts about the possibility of purchasing Scargill 'but it became clear that God had other ideas... As we went on through the establishment of the community, the development of the ministry, the repair and development of the buildings we saw more of God's hand at work.' All four of them bear witness to God's faithful provision of people, time and money from the re-opening to the pandemic and beyond, through what Chris calls 'immense and faith-stretching challenges.' From his detailed knowledge of Scargill finances, John calculates that we had received 'donations and legacies totalling over £5 million by 2022' and he concludes, 'It's all a remarkable testimony to God's goodness and the love that people have for Scargill.'

Each of the departing Council members has commented on their enjoyment of their relationships with the resident community and working friends, and the feeling is mutual! Chris thanks Phil and Di for 'the tone they have set... I love the values at the heart of Scargill, it's a place of inclusive welcome to all, a community with Jesus at the centre, and the laughter we all enjoy is a sign of something serious going on!' John counts working with other members of the finance committee among his highlights and adds, 'leaving aside the finances, my most enduring memory of Scargill from the start and even stronger now is the love, joy and peace we enjoy here and the fact that it is so much fun sharing it all!'

Hilary was attracted to 'shared life underpinned by prayer and hospitality' and describes Scargill as 'an important part of my spiritual travels, and that of my family... for over 30 years.' Stephen says, 'I have felt very blessed by God and humbled to have been part of this amazing adventure of faith.'

The resident community are also hugely grateful to Chris for his contribution as Chair. Chris is familiar with the joys and challenges of community life from his time as Warden of Lee Abbey and he has brought much practical wisdom and personal warmth to his role at Scargill. Apart from advising behind the scenes and teaching from the front, dozens of community members have come and gone during his time and he has been proactive in learning our names and making time for conversation. He writes, 'my involvement at Scargill has been one of the most important and fulfilling things of my whole life and ministry... My commitment to Scargill will continue into the future, albeit in different ways.' We're very glad to hear it!

A Rocha links and how community are keeping the promise to care for creation

From Anna Reily who has returned to Scargill to join the Estate team

'We see Jesus enjoying and valuing the natural world. God has generously entrusted us with a very beautiful part of the environment, so are you willing to be involved in carefully looking after his gift to us?' This is a challenging question, and a promise to keep and one that we are continuing to work on through living out our lives on community together.

What are we currently doing?

We are a Partner in Action with the Christian charity A Rocha UK. This means we are part of a support network of Christian land managers across the country where we can ask practical questions and share wisdom with each other about how we manage our land. This wealth of knowledge is invaluable. I went to the annual retreat for Partners in Action in November. It was encouraging and inspiring to meet up with other like-minded people.



On the estate, we are continuing to care for the range of habitats here to encourage wildlife to flourish. We were delighted to discover some newts had taken up residence in the sensory garden pond last year. Tawny and barn owls are often seen around the woodland, and occasionally long-eared owls too. Strimming and raking our meadows in autumn encourages wildflower growth. Within the house, we are looking at ways to continue to improve our sustainability in all areas, including recent experiments with a hot composter to recycle more of our food waste.

The Walled Garden - a place of hope and restoration

n early November evening saw part of the wall of our much loved Walled Garden come down. It made a thunderous noise and yet the falling rubble managed to miraculously miss Jo's car, parked alongside, leaving it almost totally unscathed. Phil G, one of our chaplains, took this inspirational photograph the following day. The photo, I feel, speaks profoundly as a metaphor of our lives. It's clearly there to see. Our lives are like the broken wall with all its contradictions, unresolved issues and brokenness.

Then there is the rainbow's promise of God's love and grace not just over the wall but over us as well. We too are all invited to live our lives under God's blessing. This is not as easy as it sounds – Henri Nouwen writes: 'The power of the darkness around us is strong, and our world finds it easier to manipulate self-rejecting people than self-accepting people. But when we keep listening attentively to the voice calling us the Beloved, it becomes possible to live our brokenness, not as a confirmation of our fear that we are worthless, but as an opportunity to purify and deepen the blessing that rests upon us.'

The Walled Garden has been a place of hope and restoration for many of us over the years. It has been a living symbol of the resurrected Scargill. God loves gardens especially those that become places of encounter and grace. Right at the beginning of Genesis, we learn that God desires and longs for relationship with us and, in the Gospels, the garden of Gethsemane is the place where Jesus gives his 'yes' to the suffering of the Cross. It is also the place of Resurrection: a place of wonder and mystery, where we can experience new life, where hope can be rekindled. Isaiah wrote: 'You (we) will be like a well-watered garden, a gurgling spring that never runs dry. You'll use the old rubble of past lives to build anew, rebuild the foundations from out of your past. You'll be known as those who can fix anything, restore old ruins, rebuild and renovate, make the community liveable again.' (Isaiah 58:12 MSG)

To finish, Tom Wright added a fifth stanza to the poem 'Let Beauty Awake' that beautifully speaks of resurrection and the garden:

Let Beauty awake in the morn
From the cool of the grave
Beauty awake from death
Let beauty awake
For Jesus' sake
In the hour when the angels their silence break
And the garden is bright with his breath
Let Beauty awake from death

Phil adds: 'We will be restoring and strengthening the wall this year. Obviously we will be taking funds from other projects to do this. If you would like to donate to the restoring of the wall of the Walled Garden, then your donation would be most welcome.'





Rates and Rooms

- Our standard adult rates for 2023 and until the end of February 2024 are: Weekend £152, Monday to Friday £294. Private guests are charged at an equivalent programme rate. Rates for shorter or longer stays are calculated pro rata.
- These rates are per person and for full board. There is no supplement payable for single occupancy of a bedroom.
- Some events in our programme vary from this price - please see the individual listings.
- For children and youth use the table below for adjustments to standard adult rates for a week:

0 to 4 yrs	Free

• Single parents and their children receive an additional 10% discount.

- We are unable to offer personal care for disabilities ourselves, so we ask that you bring your own carer if you will need this attention. We will offer your carer a 20% discount, please ask about this when booking.
- We have a limited number of lovely ensuite rooms available at the cost of £10 extra per person per night. If you would like to request an ensuite room please indicate this when booking.
- Weekend programmes run from 4pm on Friday to 2pm on Sunday. Mid-week programmes run from 4pm on Monday to 10am on Friday.
- Day visits are often possible. For individuals or small groups joining the teaching programme or for small groups needing a private meeting room, our day rates for 2023 and until the end of February 2024 are £23.25 per person. For individuals wanting space on their own or for small groups not needing a private meeting room, our day rates are £17.50 per person. In either case, the day rate includes lunch and two breaks with refreshments.
