Refurbished Marsh Lounge, new car park and more



How can I keep from singing

have been singing all my life; ever since I joined the church choir as a young boy, I have been lucky enough to be able to sing in choirs, choral societies and opera companies, as well as perform and entertain people with songs and arias that I love. However, the two things that I value the most about singing are firstly, the way it draws me to other people and secondly, how it instils in me a sense of the transcendence, the presence of God. Without those two things, I don't think I would be where I am today, living in Community, here at Scargill.

I remember visiting a remote village in Tanzania many years ago and as we approached, the sound of singing could be heard from far away – it wasn't a choir, it was simply the people of the village welcoming us into their community. The time we spent in that village was filled with a soundtrack of song that not only bound the villagers together with each other, but also spoke of their hospitality and faith where Christ was present among us.

For a long time, we have known that singing is good for our health and that it has the ability to draw us together and create community. A quick look at other cultures reminds us that for many people, singing is simply part of what it means to be part of a tribe or a faith or a tradition.

For many years I have championed the use of simple unaccompanied songs as a means to discover the gift of singing together. There are many songs from around the world which are good to sing and encourage all to participate – we call this 'natural voice singing' or 'paper-less song' as it requires no paper for words or music and so it is a natural way to sing. We don't need to be able to read music or to be experienced singers, we just need the willingness to listen and trust the person leading, allowing them to teach everything needed in order for



the song to be sung. It is the quickest way I know to connect people together. We can be singing songs in 3 or 4 part harmony within minutes and the joy it brings is immediate and so life-giving.

In recent years I have been working with Shaun Lambert, who many of you will know as a member of our extended Community here and an expert in the world of Christian mindfulness. Shaun and I have worked closely to bring these two worlds together and we have found a deep richness in courses where we can talk about paying attention, being in the present moment and noticing what is happening around us and within us. What we find is that when we sing together, we can experience these things in a rich and beautiful way. God is definitely present among us and together we can be aware that when we lift our voices, we join with the angels in heaven in an endless song of praise:

"Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory, hosanna in the heights."

As I write I am preparing to go on an early April holiday to Norway. The temperature is likely to be several degrees colder than it is in England at that time of year, probably minus degrees centigrade some days and most nights. The Norwegians have a saying, 'There is no such thing as bad weather, only bad clothes!'

I wonder how often we embark on our Christian journeys with the spiritual equivalent of the wrong clothes? Jesus told his first disciples to wait in Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit had come upon them and they were clothed with power from on high. Luke offers us a picture of them praying earnestly together in the upper room until, on the Day of Pentecost, God fulfilled that promise. The New Testament is very clear that we cannot live the Christian life in our own strength. It is equally clear that the gift of the Holy Spirit is available to all.

One of the things I am hoping to see while away is the aurora borealis or northern lights. There is no guarantee of course, it depends on what is happening in the atmosphere. But what I can do is be prepared. A friend of mine who went on a similar trip a few years ago used to adjust her camera settings and put out warm clothes every night before she went to bed so she could leap into them and grab the camera as soon as the captain announced they were visible. She was rewarded with some wonderful photos.


I am one of those people who, over 50 years ago, was fortunate enough to have a powerful encounter with the Holy Spirit. It changed me, my faith and the direction of my life. In some ways it was the spiritual equivalent of seeing the aurora borealis. Except, of course, it was not as transitory and fleeting. Not everyone is blessed in this way and although I have encountered God in different ways over the years, nothing has ever matched that particular experience. It was life transforming.

The Charismatic History Project

One of the things which is occupying my time when not at Scargill or on holiday is the Charismatic History Project hosted by our partner organisation ReSource (www. resourcingrenewal.org/charismatic-history). It is seeking to record and learn from what was happening in the lives of individuals and churches between 1960 – 2000. Each person's story is unique, each church's journey slightly different. But behind each one lies a radical dependence on the Holy Spirit. Not every story is about spiritual fireworks, or aurora. Rather it is about seeking and responding to God's good gift, his Holy Spirit.

Our Scargill Identity speaks of lives that are transformed by the love and joy of God that is found in Jesus Christ and being willing to be caught up in the ingenious creativity and adventurous life of the Holy Spirit. 'Come Holy Spirit' is not just a prayer for Pentecost but for every day of our lives. Let's pray it boldly and expectantly for ourselves, our churches and Scargill, that we may see God working in and through us for the transformation of individuals and our conflicted and hurting world.

We learned a new song at Scargill. That's one way of summing up what we gained from the seven years we spent as members of the Community. It was a song that enriched our lives. the tenacity and faith of those who refused to let the music die. Since then - and before - many have come through its doors to learn to sing again. That is if you tune out the discords: the personality clashes, the misfits (surely not us?), the occasional disagreements, the pain, the sacrifices required. But through it all, the song goes on. Whether Community member, supporter, prayer partner, quest or working friend, the hope for all is that once you've heard that enduring Scargill melody, you don't forget it. It becomes part of you and you go on your way singing and making music in your heart to God.

Bread for life

I love making and sharing bread. It's a simple process, a basic food yet rich with meaning, appearing at important points in the biblical narrative of God's relationship with humanity. The story arc of the Bible is one of human violence with two interventions by God: the giving of the Law (including remembering the Passover) is designed to limit violence; Jesus' coming, submitting to crucifixion and teaching us to absorb violence is remembered in communion. Passover and the Last Supper are not pleasant social gatherings but re-enactments of rescue. They begin with

people in bondage, slavery, or a long way from where God intended them (us) to be. Jesus weeps over Jerusalem as he arrives there for the last time and tells his disciples, 'Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains a single grain. But if it dies, it produces many seeds! (John 12v24)

Grain is cut down and crushed to make flour which becomes something nourishing. God takes the destructive tragedy of the crucifixion and transforms it to give life to all. Sharing communion re-orientates us within God's story of rescue and transformation, helping us to remember our purpose. The table is a place of equality, all are welcome. It makes us face each other, come close when our instinct might be to avoid certain people, disperse or isolate ourselves. As such, the table may be an uncomfortable place. Walter Wink challenges us 'not (to) celebrate any victory feast that does not include a setting for our enemy.' As we break bread together, may it sustain us to live and pray for peace in a troubled and divided world.


Ways to enjoy Scargill
